## **Environmental Health Update**

- Environmental Health promotes the public health laws through the enforcement of State Environmental Health regulations to ensure that Hoke County citizens reside in a clean and safe environment.
- Environmental Health departments are responsible for protecting the public through the application of principles of environmental science and epidemiology to identify, control, and/or eliminate pathogenic agents (biological, chemical, and physical) and to limit the incidence and spread of disease in the community.

Ms. Dorsey submitted the following report:

#### **COVID Vaccinations**

- <u>November Vaccination Report</u>: 855 boosters, 7 additional doses, 86 first doses, and 92 second doses.
- <u>Pediatric Vaccines</u>: <u>41</u> first doses and <u>50</u> second doses provided.
- <u>Upcoming</u>: Pediatric vaccines will be offered at the elementary and middle schools starting in January 2022.
- The Hoke County Schools Vaccination clinics will provide first and second doses as well as boosters.
- Vaccinations are provided monthly at Hoke County Detention Center.
- The Hoke County Health Department nurses provide COVID-19 vaccines to homebound clients.
- COVID-19 outbreaks at long-term care facilities: one outbreak at Open Arms and another outbreak at Autumn Care
